Ambrose L. Schmitt, age 87, of Jasper, Indiana, passed away at 10:23 a.m. on Tuesday (June 7, 2016) at home.

Ambrose was born in Jasper, Indiana, on October 27, 1928 to Henry and Catherine (Stratman) Schmitt. He married Sally Sermersheim on May 15, 1954, in St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Jasper.

Ambrose was the Owner and Operator of the Dubois County Insurance Agency for over 30 years.

He was a 1946 graduate of Jasper High School.

He was an Army Veteran serving during the Korean War.
