Bernard (Barney) Moeller, age 89 of Jasper, Indiana, passed away at 4:56 p.m. Wednesday, (December 23, 2015), at Springs Valley Meadows Health Care in French Lick, Indiana.

He was born in Ferdinand, Indiana on December 30, 1925 to Leo and Veronica (Helming) Moeller. He was married to Catherine (Doris) Dosch on September 28, 1946. She preceded him in death on March 4, 1993. He married Valeda Jahn on July 7, 2001, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Jasper, Indiana.

Barney Moeller was a WWII Army Veteran serving with the 100th Infantry Division. He was awarded the Silver Star during WWII. He was named the Dubois County distinguished Veteran of the year 2003. He retired from Kimball International where he worked in quality control for nearly forty years.

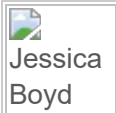
