He was born at Mariah Hill Indiana on June 25, 1925 to Albert and Olga Keck Lindauer, he married Romona Englert on September 27, 1947 at St. Ferdinand Catholic Church. He retired from the Jasper Woodworking Company and for many years was a bricklayer. Norman A. Lindauer was a WWII Army Veteran; he was a platoon Tech Sergeant in the 143 rd Regimental combat team of the 36th Texas infantry division. He participated in the landing at Anzio Beachhead subsequent battle for Rome and the southern France invasion which culminated in Germany with the surrender of the German armies. He was an interpreter for his unit and was present at the interrogation of Herman Goerring, head of the German Luftwaffe. He received the European Campaign Medal with 4 battle stars and one Bronze Arrowhead, the Combat Infantryman Badge, Victory Medal and the Good Conduct Medal. His memberships include Holy Family Catholic Church and the V.F.W. Post # 673 in Jasper. Surviving is his wife Romona 3 daughters,
