812-482-4141 Dateline Jasper, Indiana Othmar "Ottie" Mathias, age 91, passed away at 4:38 p.m. Friday (February 1, 2013) in Memorial Hospital & Health Care Center in Jasper. He was born at Loogootee, Indiana September 15, 1921 to Joseph and Barbara (Prechtel) Mathies. He married Florentine Seger on May 4, 1946 at St. Raphael's Catholic Church in Dubois, Indiana. Ottie was a member of the 80th Division Company E. 318th Regiment of the U.S. Army during WWII. He earned the Bronze Star for his service and has contributed pictures and documents to the Holocaust Museum. He helped liberate prisoners from the Dachau Concentration Camp. Over the last decade, Ottie had shared these military experiences with local schools and universities to help preserve these historical events, and sacrifices made by those soldiers who never returned. In 2012 he received the Hoosier Hero award in Indianapolis, Indiana.
