Samuel C. Voelkel, age 74, of Boone Township, Indiana, passed away at 6:11 a.m. on Tuesday, April 26, 2022, in Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center in Jasper, Indiana.

Sam was born in Jasper, Indiana, on November 15, 1947, to Radius and Eldena (Buchta) Voelkel.

He was a 1965 graduate of Ireland High School.

He was owner of Jasper Communications from 1976 until his retirement.

Sam enjoyed photography, especially wildlife photography and taking photos of star constellations and buildings. He was also an electronics inventor, and enjoyed computers and woodworking.

Surviving is one brother, Bret (Sharon) Voelkel, Jasper, IN, one sister-in-law, Rebeca Voelkel, Lawrenceburg, IN, four nieces, Lori Voelkel, Marissa (Dwayne) Curry, Victoria Voelkel, and Sara Voelkel, and two nephews, Steven and Andy Voelkel.
