



# Stanley Gerald Weisenberger

May 8, 1943 - July 27, 2024

Stanley Gerald Weisenberger, age 81, of Jasper, Indiana, passed into eternity at 9:33 p.m. on Saturday, July 27, 2024, at home surrounded by family and he will now greet every sunrise on a lake, pulling in Blue Gill with his best fishing buddy, Julius Mueller, and every sunset on a peaceful motorcycle ride.

Stan was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on May 8, 1943, to Joseph G. and Ruth H. (Bilaski) Weisenberger. He married Janice E. Gilmore, on September 24, 1966, at Precious Blood Church in Dayton, Ohio.
